You are to complete a round of 9 holes of golf at a golf course with an official course rating at a time specified by your teacher. The nine holes should be conducted on “full” courses rather than pitch and chip type course. Pars 3 - 5 should be available.

The teacher or other designated adult (e.g. member of the club) will observe and score your round and sign off on your scorecard.

Your completed scorecard will be submitted to the teacher to process against ‘Stableford’ scoring system to award the NCEA grade for your performance.

Modified Stableford Scoring System

Use the scores below. Do not use individual handicaps.

Hole Score	Male Stableford Points	Female Stableford Points
2 under par [eagle]	6	7
1 under par [birdie]	5	6
Par	4	5
1 over par [bogey]	3	4
2 over par [double bogie]	2	3
3 over par	1	2
4 over par	0	1

NB. Students **MUST NOT** mark their own cards. Try using club members, parents or available staff.

Placing

Regardless of the course ruling, placing of 30cm is allowed for any balls landing on any CUT FAIRWAY area. This fairway may be that which the student is playing down or any other fairway on which he/she may land.

Extreme Weather and/or Playing Conditions

In extremes of weather or playing conditions the teacher should ask the course professionals for a more realistic course rating for that day (if this adjustment has not already been done). If the teacher is still unhappy then postpone the assessment to a later date.
